

BOYNE CITY PUBLIC PARKS



Most city parks can be reserved for individual events. Contact City Hall for information.

Please enjoy visiting and utilizing our City Parks. For the enjoyment of all, please observe these general rules:

- Pets must be on leash at all times and owner must clean up after their pets.
- Pets are not allowed in parks during special community events.
- Camping, fires (except in grills), and fireworks are prohibited.
- All litter must be deposited in trash receptacles or taken from the park.
- Respect abutting private properties.
- Observe posted park hours.
- Adhere to all other individually posted rules.

1 AVALANCHE PRESERVE

An outdoor wonderland of experiences awaits you at Avalanche and its 320 acres of sloping forested terrain. Avalanche offers year-round activities including hiking, mountain biking, jogging, disc golf, sledding, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, ice skating and an archery range. There are 3 miles of designated hiking trails and 12 miles of single-track and 4 miles of two-track trails, including beginner, intermediate and advanced mountain biking. Abundant wildlife, morel mushrooms and wild berry bushes add to the beauty of this park. Four hundred thirty-seven steps ascend to platforms overlooking spectacular views, where on a clear day, you can see up to 15 miles down Lake Charlevoix. Park facilities include a warming house, restrooms and parking. Avalanche is accessed from Wilson Street and from the historic Waterworks Park and Trailhead on Division Street which includes restrooms, parking and a historical display. Motorized vehicles, except for snowmobiles, are prohibited in the park.

2 ROTARY PARK

Many community activities, including tennis, adult softball leagues, high school softball and 4-H youth soccer make Rotary so special to residents and visitors. The tennis courts, pickle ball courts, soccer fields and ball fields are open for public use when there is not a scheduled event. The park also has a pavilion, restrooms, a small playground and a children's "Discovery Learning Trail," surrounded by a natural wooded setting.

3 OLD CITY PARK

Centrally located downtown along the Boyne River, the park has many beautiful mature native trees for shade. A charming gazebo in the center of the park is host to summer concerts and many community and family events. Additional features include picnic tables, benches, a small playground, historic fountain, canoe/kayak pull-out ramp and fishing access.

4 CHARLEVOIX STREET LOOK-OUT

This scenic overlook area features a deck and benches that provide a view of Lake Charlevoix.

5 OPEN SPACE

The Boyne City Open Space is a park in progress. The community's vision is to purchase the property, develop it into a public park and preserve on beautiful Lake Charlevoix for all to enjoy. The future park consists of just over 4 acres and approximately 600 ft. of lake frontage. While not developed yet, the public is welcome and encouraged to use and enjoy the property. Benches and picnic tables are available for seating.

6 LOWER LAKE ACCESS

This small sandy beach offers a great place on Lake Charlevoix to enjoy swimming, a picnic or watch a sunset.

7 SUNSET PARK

Located on Lake Charlevoix at the mouth of the Boyne River, this is a perfect spot to watch amazing sunsets and soak in all the beauty of the lake. Picnic tables, benches and a public fishing pier make Sunset a wonderful gathering place in the heart of downtown Boyne City.

8 RIDGE RUN DOG PARK

Situated on the north end of Boyne City off Charlevoix and Ridge Streets, the park offers an off-leash, fee-free place for dogs and their families to play, exercise and socialize. There are two separate fenced areas, one for large dogs, which is approximately 2 acres, and a half acre area for small dogs. Amenities include benches, water fountains, wading pool and waste bag stations; groomed fitness trails within the perimeter of the park for humans to exercise. This park requires dogs to be up-to-date on vaccinations.

9 RIVERSIDE PARK

Nature abounds in this quiet park nestled in a wetland area along the Boyne River, making it a perfect spot to birdwatch or launch a kayak. The area is abundant with deer, frogs, turtles and other wildlife. Picnic table and benches provide a place to relax and enjoy the great outdoors.

10 PENINSULA BEACH

Just a short walk from downtown, this city park offers a public swimming beach with restrooms, picnic tables, grills, benches, playground equipment, and volleyball court. This is a great location for families to play on a warm day. A Mobi-Mat provides handicap access to Lake Charlevoix.

11 TANNERY PARK

Located on Lake Charlevoix, Tannery Park is a good place for swimming, picnicking, skipping stones and capturing blazing sunsets. This park is pet-friendly.

12 VETERANS PARK

The hub of many community events, Veterans Park includes a children's wooden playscape, covered pavilion, shade trees, grills, ball field, boat launch, restrooms, fishing and the best farmers market in Northern Michigan. The park also features a beautiful Veteran's Memorial that pays tribute to veterans past and present. Adjacent to the park is the City Hall, the municipal marina and a smallboat launch.

13 BOYNE RIVER NATURE AREA

There is no better place to enjoy the beauty of the Boyne River. The nature area features a pavilion, wooden walkways, benches, decks, access to the river, and ample parking.

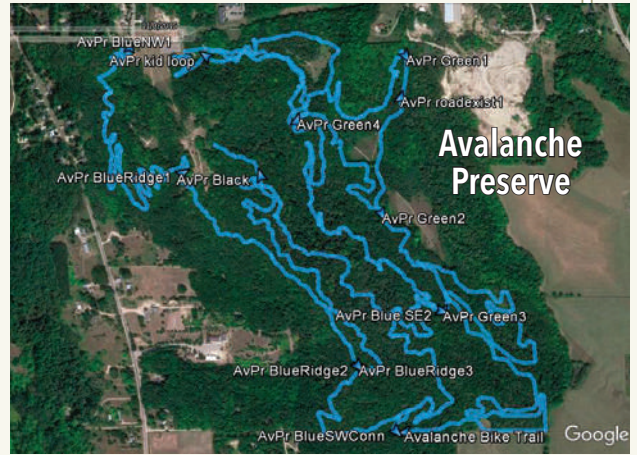
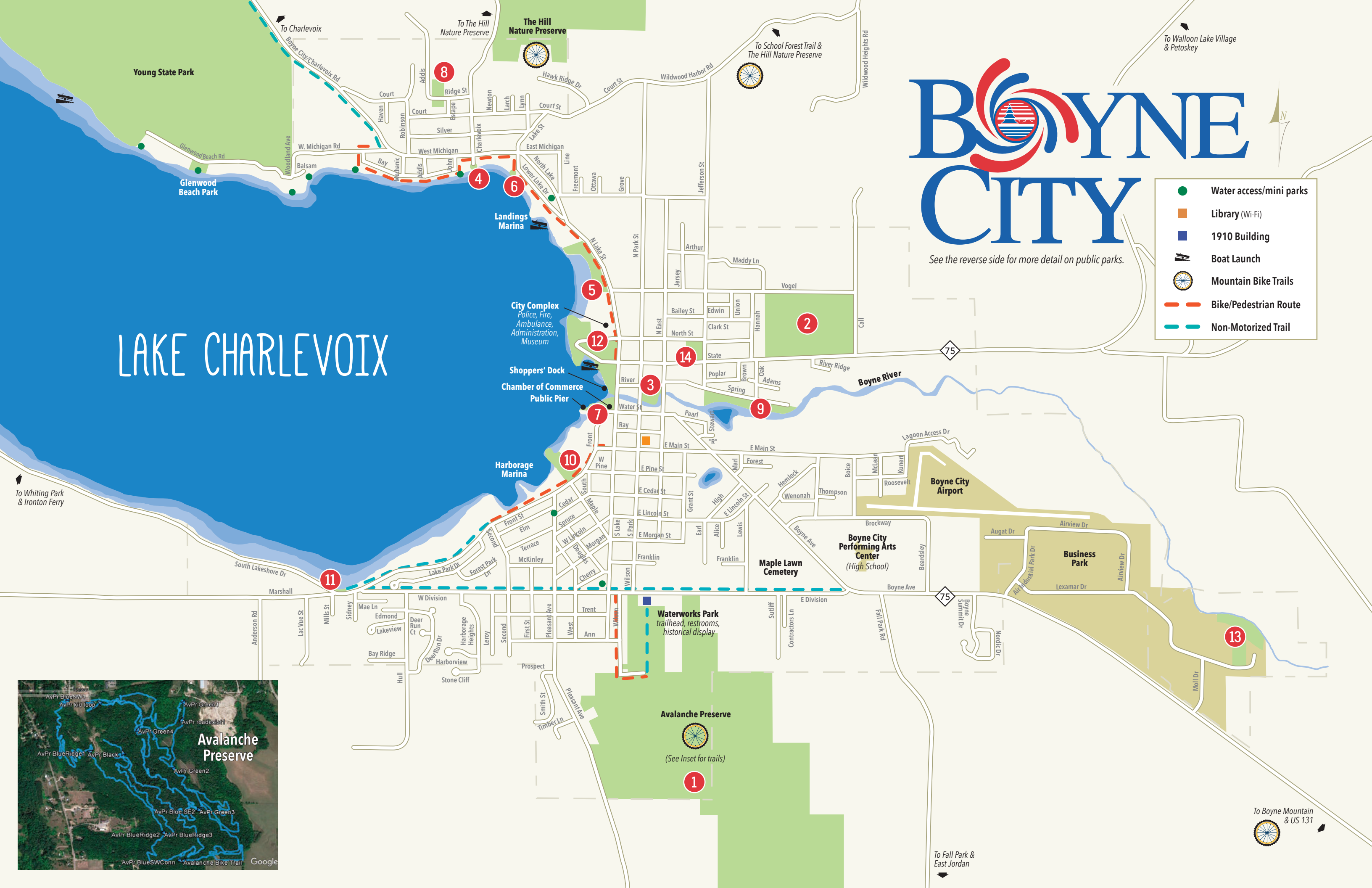
